

**From Past to Future: Math 70 Spring 2017 [On the last day of class, students were asked:
If you could give advice to my future students at the beginning of next term, what would you say?]**

Don't show up to class late.

Be aware of the PQs...

Be as involved with the class as possible. Being excited to learn new concepts often means you retain them a little better.

Buckle up cause homeworks will eat you alive

Do not slack off on homework even if it is online. Those points add up. Take notes in class, too.

Do not delay your MathXL activities, if you wait too much the work might consume your time greatly.

Study hard and well.

Study more and make sure you do good on the practice [final] exam.

Remember to study and always do your homework.

I'll say to focus a lot n classes & to manage time wisely.

I would say to always do the homework right after class. And do it because it will help on the next PQ.

Try to get ahead on the homework b/c some of it is long either too many problems or just has too many components.

Take time to study weekly. Carefully solve the homework. Do all the extra credits. Try to solve every problem.

Ask questions if you don't understand something. Don't let the moment pass you by.

I would say pay attention and study.

Keep all quizzes to study from.

To ask you questions, because you are willing to help.

Don't forget about the homework.

I would say to just ask questions even if you think they may seem "dumb" Ms. Carey will do what she can so you better understand the work.

They need to keep track of the course, not miss any class because they miss a lot, and that there is a lot of homework, but at the end will be helpful.

Give yourself a good amount of time to do the MXL homework because it takes a while to complete.

I would tell them to stay on top of the MathXL homework and not to write in pen.

I would tell them to manage their time efficiently.

Stay on top of the hw. When I didn't do the hw I failed pqs which had a compounding effect on the damage done to my grade.

Get as much help from you as possible, use your resources like mathxl and the internet, tutors, and anything else that helps.

Do the coursera [study skills] RIGHT AWAY!! The valuable lessons I learned would have been helpful to apply towards my studying earlier on.

To come to class prepared. Always expect a PQ.

There will be too much work in this class, but it will worth it.

Don't fall behind on the homework!!! It will destroy you.

Concentrate, take the time to understand the material and believe in yourself.

Do HW ahead of time & note a few hours before class, also study before class for PQ's.

Learn to use other resources to strengthen your mastery over a subject.

Always stay on your work and try not to fall behind. Also miss little to no class b/c every class there is 2 lessons so if you miss class you miss 2 lessons. [MW or TTh sections]

To just stay focused and on top of everything and you'll pass

Do your homework even if it's a lot, study every day for your PQ's and keep track of your grade (there's extra credit for that).

1. Do all the homework. It's an easy way to keep your grade up. MathXL is very helpful. [There's not a 2.] Go to class everyday, do not miss PQs!

Try to start off strong as possible, make sure you ask a lot of questions and constantly review.

Every point counts!!!

Study a lot for the exams.

To do all the homework, because it's a large chunk of your grades & if you do the homework, you'll most likely ace all of your PQs, which is another chunk of your grades. AND always come to class.

Study a few days before the exam Review all the work (GCs, MML, & PQs)

Do all the hw.

I would tell them to ask questions, and to not shy away because as a teacher you do make a great attempt to have students understand this class.

Don't wait until last minute for Hw.

Get a study buddy [if] you're incapable of motivating yourself to do the harder and work-packed problems online on your own.

I would say that hw takes too long so be prepared, but I mean you will also learn more on your own.

I'd tell them every pt. counts in this class do all hw get 100% on all hw assignments don't forget to do SS assignments study every day for PQs try to get 9/10 or 10/10 study ahead of time for exams go to tutoring if you are ever stuck.

Be prepared and do your work because it pays off.

MathXL is key.

I would say for them to do the homework as soon as possible. If one day is missed there are no do overs.

Do the HW, pass the PQs. It helps with exams.

Write down the section on each handout, review after class, study PQ's and do all of your homework.

I say do every homework and extra credit activities, it will help you a lot.

Wi-fi access points will be your best friend!!! Search far and wide for wifi to do homework outside of home.

If you get that settled, you're golden the entire semester. (AKA do your hw!!)

Takes notes. Ask a lot of questions. Write down the formulas on the exam and get along with the teacher.

Work hard and always show work.

Time management is key! If you don't understand, ask! STUDY!!!

Do the homework!! Keep your PQ's and review them before each exam.

I would tell them to do all their work, it adds up faster than they' will think it will.

Make sure to do your homework since the quizzes sometimes have a question or two from them.

Be organized and make sure to keep track of your points.

Stay on top of your work and keeping u grade record sheet on excel is easier to correct mistakes.

Be prepared to do homework. Come to class ready to learn b/c you will be tested on your knowledge every day. However, you will actually learn & retain more information than you ever have in a math class.

Keep up on the grade sheet.

To keep studying hard, because college is a completely different level.

Keep your GRS up to date.
